ORPHANAGECARE

An orphanage houses children of various ages who either have no family or have lost their families in natural calamities. The home usually has a care-taker who monitors the children of the orphanage and a few helpers to take care of the residents. It looked like the house was without maintenance for years together. Sometimes parents get sick and die while their child or children are still young, and if no close relatives take care of them, if they cannot or will not do so, they are normally raised in an orphanage. When several children, brothers or sisters are left orphaned they are normally split up; one child going to one family or one child going to a foster family while another may stay in the orphanage. Sometimes parents may not have jobs or money and abandon their children because they cannot afford to bring them up. The parents may feel that if someone else brings them up they may have a better future in the long run.

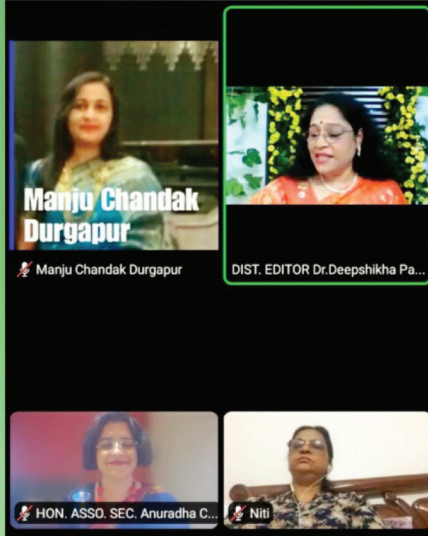
One in five districts in the country does not have even a single orphanage, and majority districts don't have the minimum three orphanages needed (one for children of less than 6 years of age and one each for boys and girls of 6-18 years respectively). Orphans and vulnerable children do not even have separate legislation in India, they are part of the Juvenile Justice Act. The primary focus being under 18 criminals, even in the law that should protect them, they are lost. This historical neglect could have arisen for many reasons. In India, there are always more beneficiaries and claimants than funds, and orphans and destitute children have no one speaking for them.

The visit to the orphanage was a fulfilling experience as I came back home with not only memories but also some valuable lessons. A visit to an orphanage is a life-changing experience as it is filled with emotions and sentiments. Here in my place there is also an Orphanage. Inner Wheel Club of Duliajan has taken initiatives for the development of the Orphanage from the inception of the club. It is also a permanent project of Inner Wheel Club of Duliajan. This year we have taken the project to supply balanced diet to them and we also assured them that every month we will provide them nutritious food and daily requirements for conquering loneliness and spreading smiles on their faces. Every month we have plan to visit them and provided them their daily requirements eg. soap, surf, bedsheet, sanitizer, fruits, biscuits, cakes, sanitary napkins, towel, balti, mugs etc.

Charity Begins at Home: Helping Orphans in Need is Our Biggest Responsibility. At Orphan Life Foundation, we are always striving to make this world a better and more liveable place for the young and destitute orphans in need. But we can only stretch out a helping hand if you support us. If you help us, we will fulfil our commitment of giving hope to the hopeless.

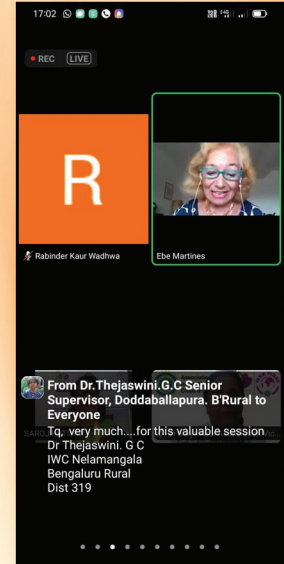

- ▶ Don't delay the salary of the workmen, staff in your company. Salary on time will help you to get good workmen in industry.
- ▶ Do not make wrong commitments for getting work orders which you will not be able to fulfill.
- ▶ Don't mix personal and professional relations or business transactions.

Pradhan Mantri MUDRA Yojana (PMMY) Scheme

- ▶ Mudra was launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on April 8, 2015 for providing loans up to 10 lakh to the non-corporate, non-farm small/micro enterprises.
- ▶ Under Mudra 3 products are cover:
 - (i) Shishu - Covering loans upto 50,000
 - (ii) Kishore - Covering loans above 50,000 and upto 5 lakh
 - (iii) Tarun - Covering loans above 5 lakh and upto 10 lakh
- ▶ These loans are given by Commercial Banks, RRBs, Small Finance Banks, MFIs and NBFCs. The borrower can approach any of the lending institutions mentioned above or can apply online through this portal www.sbi.com/mudra.

Breastfeeding lowers your baby's risk of having asthma or allergies. Plus, babies who are breastfed exclusively for the first 6 months, without any formula, have fewer ear infections, respiratory illnesses, and bouts of diarrhea. They also have fewer hospitalizations and trips to the doctor. Breastfeeding has been linked to higher IQ scores in later childhood in some studies. What's more, the physical closeness, skin-to-skin touching, and eye contact all help your baby bond with you and feel secure. Breastfed infants are more likely to gain the right amount of weight as they grow rather than become overweight children. The AAP says breastfeeding also plays a role in the prevention of SIDS (sudden infant death syndrome). It's been thought to lower the risk of diabetes, obesity, and certain cancers as well, but more research is needed.

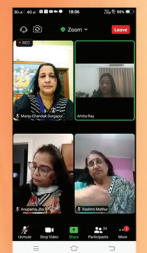

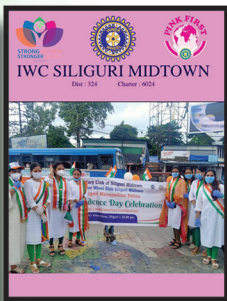


India's Independence Day is significant as it stands as a reminder of the sacrifices that many freedom fighters made to get independence from British rule. It is a national holiday and it is usually observed throughout the nation with the hoisting of the tricolour, parades and cultural events. India's first prime minister Jawaharlal Nehru raised the Indian national flag above the Lahori Gate of Red Fort in Delhi on August 15, 1947. It is a tradition that has since been followed by the incumbent Prime Minister, followed by an address to the country.

- 1. The song 'Bharoto Bhagyo Bidhata' composed in 1911 by Nobel laureate Rabindranath Tagore was renamed as 'Jana Gana Mana' and adopted by the Constituent Assembly of India as the national anthem on January 24, 1950.*
- 2. The Indian national flag with three horizontal stripes of red, yellow and green was hoisted on August 7, 1906, at Parsee Bagan Square in Kolkata. The first variant of India's current national flag was designed by freedom fighter Pingali Venkayya in 1921. The current flag with saffron, white and green colours and the Ashok Chakra in the middle was officially adopted on July 22, 1947, and hoisted on August 15, 1947.*
- 3. Five other countries celebrate their independence on August 15 along with India. They are Bahrain, North Korea, South Korea and Liechtenstein.*
- 4. The Indian flag is manufactured and supplied from only one place in the nation. The Karnataka Khadi Gramodyoga Samyukta Sangha (KKGSS), located in Dharwad in Karnataka, has the authority to manufacture and supply the Indian national flag. According to the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS), the flag is manufactured only with hand-spun and handwoven cotton khadi wafting.*
- 5. Even after India's independence, Goa was still a Portuguese colony. It was annexed to India by the Indian Army only in 1961. Thus, Goa was the last state to join the Indian territory.*

About Raksha Bandhan (Rakhi)

The bonding between a brother and a sister is simply unique and is beyond description in words. The relationship between siblings is extraordinary and is given importance in every part of the world. However, when it comes to India, the relationship becomes all the more important as there is a festival called "Raksha Bandhan" dedicated for the sibling love.

This is a special Hindu festival which is celebrated in India and countries like Nepal to symbolize the love between a brother and a sister. The occasion of Raksha Bandhan is celebrated on the full moon day of the Hindu luni-solar calendar in the month of Shravana which typically falls in the August month of Gregorian calendar.

Meaning of Raksha Bandhan

The festival is made up of two words, namely "Raksha" and "Bandhan." As per the Sanskrit terminology, the occasion means "the tie or knot of protection" where "Raksha" stands for the protection and "Bandhan" signifies the verb to tie. Together, the festival symbolizes the eternal love of brother-sister relationship which does not mean just the blood relationships only.
