




Editors Note

It was in the year 1992-93, the Inner Wheel District 324 was bifurcated from 329 and an independent Inner Wheel District was started with 10 Clubs namely Inner Wheel Clubof Asansol, Darjeeling, Durgapur, Jalpaiguri, Jorhat, Shantiniketan, Shillong, Siliguri, Siluguri Midtown and Tinsukia. The then International President was Mrs. Anita Agarwal (IWD 301). The then Association President was Dr. Lalita Seth (IWD 329). IIW Theme was "Understanding".

Guwahati's airport, Lokapriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport, is only 25km away from the city you can get a pre-paid taxi right outside the terminal.


Places to Visit ...Guwahati, kaziranga National Park, Dibru Saikhowa national Park, Orang National Park, Dibrugarh, Tezpur, Halflong, Shivsagar.

Things to Shop....Unique Souvenirs, Tea leaves, Assam Silk, Handicrafts, Pickles, Singing Bowls, Handmade Toys, Japhu n Wooden Rhino Statues, Assam Traditional Jewelry, Phulam Gamusa n Traditional Mask.

Favourite Dishes....Duck Meat Curry, Maasor Tenga(tangy fish curry), Aloo Pitika, Xaak Aru Bhaji(herbs n vegetables), Ou tenga(Food of Assam to tingle your taste buds), Paror Mangxo(pigeon meat curry), Silk Worm, Pitha(Home cooked sweet dish).

Historical Personalities....Kanaklata Baruah, Kumarila Bhatta, Badan Chandra Borphukan, Lachit Borphukan, Chilarai, Maniram Dewan, Bagh Hazarika, Kushal Konwar,

Guwahati is located on the Brahmaputra River in Assam, a state in the extreme northeast of India connected to the rest of the country by the narrow Siliguri Corridor, nearly 125 km east of the border with West Bengal and and about 62 miles north of the border with Bangladesh.









Time to Visit....Often called the abode of clouds, the best time to visit **MEGHALAYA** is between October and June. Most tourist destinations in the state receive temperatures that rarely go beyond 30c, making it a perfect escape between March and June which is the summer season in the country.

Route to Visit.... The closest one is in Guwahati. It's roughly 100kms away from Shillong and can be used to arrive at the capital of Meghalaya. The Guwahati station is well connected with all the other cities in India and is often used as a conduit into the state of Meghalaya too.

Places to Visit....Shillong, Mawlynnong, Dawki, Balpakram National Park, Nokrek National Park, Jowai, Tura, Umiam Lake, Baghmara, Cherrapunji, Mawsmai Cave, Elephant Falls.

Things to Shop....Shawls n Stoles, Scottish Cloth, Khasi Scrubs, Organic Produce and Products, Designer/Vintage Wear.

Favourite Dishes....Jadoh (happens to be one of the most popular Khasi street food items), Doh-khalish (Meghalaya cuisine celebrated pork in all its glory), Nakham Bitchi, Pumaloi, Pudoh, Minil-Songa, Sakin Gata.

Historical Personalities....P.A. Sangma, Karen David, Arundhati Roy, Mukul Sangma, Parag Kumar Das, Silverine Swer, Amit Paul, Chidananda Das Gupta, Shreeka Ghosh, Shima Modak.

In Shillong and this small but beautiful hill State of Meghalaya, the people are simple, straightforward and willing to listen. But they also believe in dialogue and discussion for all issues. They do not like to take orders, unless they feel that they are also taken into confidence.

Shillong the capital city of Meghalaya has been a capital city since its inception. In the course of its over-a-century old history it has attained the status of a cosmopolitan city with its own culture.











Time to Visit....The best time to Visit Nagaland for a holiday will be the initials months of winters, and summer as not only the weather will be mild, salubrious, and balmy but also this is when one can be a part of the festival celebrations like Yemshe Festival, Bushu Festival, and Hornbill Festival. If planning a vacation in Nagaland, you should once check the temperature in different seasons.

Route to Visit....Dimapur connects major cities In India like Kolkata and Guwahati with Nagaland. While it is not very easy, the route to Nagaland is a very picturesque one and worth the effort. Here is how to reach Nagaland:

By Air

Dimapur, at distance of around 75 km from Nagaland, is the closest domestic airport. Dimapur is well-connected to Guwahati and Kolkata. International travelers have to take connecting flights from Kolkata to Dimapur.

By Train

Nearest railway station is Dimapur, which is well-connected to Kolkata and Guwahati.

By Road

One can take a share taxi from Dimapur railway station (Rs 200) and reach Kohima. Direct buses also run daily between Guwahati and Kohima.

Places To Visit...Dzukou Valley, Phek, khonoma Village, Kohima War Cemetery, Naga Heritage Village, Kohima.

Things to Shop....Apart from a huge array of traditionally made products from the state, Nagaland is famous for its Naga shawls, cane carpets, Naga silk Mekhela and bamboo mugs and other such items. These are just a few really popular items that make great souvenirs of the state.

Favourite Dishes....Bamboo shoot. Sliced Bamboo Shoots, Axone (fermented soybean) Axoni in cake form. Fermented dry fish. Samathu, Aikibeye, Akini(perilla seeds) Chokibo (snails), Boiled Vegetables.

Historical Personalities....Neidonuo Angami, Mayangnokcha Ao(1901-1988),educationist and writer. Alana Golmei, rights activist. Piyong Temjen Jamir (1948-2018). Gangmumei Kamei(1939-2027), historian and politician. Darlando kha thing, former vice chancellor of University of Jharkhand.

Route to VisitThe fastest mode to reach Sikkim is, of course, Airway. We can reach Sikkim through airway by taking a flight to Bagdogra airport in West Bengal. The state capital Gangtok is well connected with West Bengal through national highways 31A which further connects to other parts of the country. Regular buses and Vabs are also available from major nearby cities to Gangtok.

Places to VisitGangtok, Tsomgo Lake, Nathula Pass, Kanchenjunga Base Camp, Lachen, Lachung and Yumthang Valley, Pelling, Zuluk n Teesta River.

Things To Shop.... Tibetan Carpets, Sikkim Tea, Thangkas, Buddhist Figurines and prayer flags, Wall Hangings, Alpine Cheese, Fresh Bamboo Shoots, Choksee, n Sikkim Liqueur.

Famous Dishes....Thupja, Momos, Dal Bhaat, Sael Roti, Chhurpi Soup, Sikkim Tea, Bamboo Shoot Curry, Dhindo, Gundruk.

Historical Personalities....Baichung Bhutia, Danny Dongzongpa, Omi Gurung, Karma Paljor, Nirmal Chrttri, Tarundeep Rai, Gadul Singh Kama, Keepu Tssring Lepcha.

This is primarily only possible between Kolkata and Bagdogra Airport, which serves as an entry point to Darjeeling, Kalimpong and other neighbouring North-east locations like Guwahati, Sikkim and even Bhutan. If you wish to conveniently get from the south to the north of the state, this is the way to do it.

Places to Visit....Kolkata, Darjeeling, Sundarban National Park, Kalimpong, Siliguri, Santiniketan, Digga, Howrah.

Things to Shop....Saree: A saree is the symbol of feminine elegance and you can't definitely miss out on the traditional sarees of Bengal like Tant, Katha and Baluchari, Dhokra Craft, Painting, Desserts, Bamboo and Jute Products, Clay Dolls, Darjeeling Tea, Terracotta Souvenirs.

Favourite Dishes....Macher Jhol, Kosha maangso(Mutton Curry), Shosho Ilish(Hilda Fish Cooked In Mustard Gravy), Shukto(Mix Veg Stew/Curry), Aloo Ppsto (Spiced Potatoes Cooked in Poppy Seeds), Luchi(Bengali Fried Flatbread), Misti Doi(Traditional Bengali Sweet).

Historical Personalities....Sri Sri Chaitanya Mahaprabhu (1486-1534), Rani Rashmoni (1793-1861), Michael Madhusudan Dutta (1824-1873), Sri Sri Ramakrishna Paramhamsa (1836-1886), Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay (1838-1894), Keshab Chabra Sen (1838-1884), Girish Chandra ghosh (1844-1912), Maa Sarada Devi (1853-1920).





In Bengal the British, who had been trading there since 1650s, settled for Calcutta as their base around 1690. Here a collection of bungalows which looked like 'thatched hovels', a stables, a hospital, a barracks, and a powder magazine could all be found huddled next to the imposing Fort William. The three as yet unpromising settlements of Bombay, Madras and Calcutta, were eventually to become the power centers of British rule in India.

Served the District as Chairman of our district's 1st District Conference held in Siliguri in the year 1992 with great success. Association President Dr. Lalita Seth was our chief guest. Being conference chairman I had the opportunity to meet many Inner Wheel members of different clubs in our district.

Subsequently served the district as District Treasurer in year 1993-94, as Vice Chairman in the year 1994-95 and became District Chairman in the year 1995-96. The following year (1996-97) became the A.C. Member.

Five new clubs were formed in the district during my tenure.

Visited all the clubs in our district and have very nostalgic memories of the amount of love and affection bestowed by all the sisters of Inner Wheel Clubs. I shall treasure and cherish that all my life.

First District Rally and Intercity meet was held during my tenure as chairman Attended both the programmes by all the clubs in large numbers.

Another first in the District during my tenure as chairman was starting of "SEVA" where fund was raised from Inner wheel members and Rotarians and their well wishers. This was used to be distributed for any good service project done by different clubs. The project was appreciated by all the clubs in the district.

I am very proud of one project which was initiated during my chairmanship. This is about "Safe Drinking Water" for school children. This is a project of Siliguri Inner Wheel Club. The children of the primary school was very happy to have drinking water from a tap.

My hats off to the members of Siliguri club for this project. The project is still running. Few pictures of the project are attached.




PDC Dr.Sumita Deb belongs to IWC Shillong. She being a professional doctor had her hands full but courageously took over the helm of the IWD 324.




The experiences which I had during my long association with Inner Wheel made me a more stronger person both physically and mentally.





Another visit that stands out in my memory is the visit to residential school of Deaf and Dumb in Asansol. Members of IWC Asansol were helping this school at that time. Children gave a flawless dance performance, without being able to hear a note of music. They were trying to be self sustaining by doing Mushroom Culture and candle making and other hand crafted articles. And like these were so many others. Visits to these places used to touch my heart and I felt awed by the number of lives our members were touching by their efforts.

But my best remains the Kala Niketan started by my home club. It was a unique project in itself as it focussed on building a happier society by giving better opportunities to children for extracurricular development. IWC started classical dance, Bollywood dance, piano, guitar, violin, vocal music, painting and personality development classes for different age groups of children. In a matter of few months it became a most sought after place by parents and students alike. We were packed to capacity with classes running from 8 Am in the morning to late evenings on weekends. Our members were on round the clock duty, as we were committed to provide safe, clean and heathy environment for all our attendees. Not only were the children getting engaged in very enjoyable and productive activities, but also the talented teachers were employed handsomely. There was an annual extravaganza called Rainbow, where students and teachers used to showcase their talents in front of the audience packed to full capacity in the auditorium. Organizing and running Kalaniketan was a stupendous task which members of Inner wheel Club of Gangtok did with great aplomb.

Apart from these, there are memories of great fun and enjoyment at District functions. I am enclosing few photographs to revisit the wonderful times.





Inner Wheel is my passion, my oxygen.





overwhelmed by their love and care. And next day I had to travel to Dibrugarh. No trains were plying and I had to reach Dibrugarh the very next day. I managed to get a seat in the night bus. Traveling alone in the night by a bus on an unknown route I was petrified but here also Wasima di came in as my guardian angel. She kept in touch with me for almost the whole journey and early in the morning she and dada were there to receive me at the bus stop. Even now I get goosebumps when I think of that night.

I was very touched by a project done by IWC Malda. They gave a special child who was orphaned a wheelchair and left alone to be looked after by her care taker. The members saw to it that she got a job in a school in the administration block. The joy and the happiness of the girl are still fresh in my mind. Sitting on the wheelchair she felt she had become independent. Such gestures by our Inner Wheel friends are unforgettable.

Inner Wheel has definitely changed me. It has taught me time management, it has made me more compassionate and tolerant. It is indeed a platform to pursue what you enjoy doing. I guess we are all different flowers from the same garden.













